Departmental Whitley Councils

The attention of the Central Whitley Council has once more a drawn to the non-existence or unsatisfactory functioning of Departmental Whitley Council in several Ministries/Departments.

It has been reported that in some areas the Departmental Mey Council is not functioning properly because officials in the ir do not have the required authority to take decisions. It is understood that in other areas problems relating to staff meentation on the Departmental Whitley Council have precluded Council from being constituted altogether.

The purpose of this circular is to impress upon Supervising ters the need to establish a forum for consultations/negotiations staff associations. Such a forum could be in the form of a whitley Council or through informal discussions.

Supervising Officers are kindly requested to arrange for dar meetings with recognized staff associations to discuss remental matters of common concern in the interest of efficiency good staff relations. Such meetings should, as far as possible, resided over by the Supervising Officer himself or by a senior first delegated by him with power to take decisions whenever fred.
