Uniforms

At paragraph 15.12.16 of its 2003 Report, the Pay Research Bureau recommended that grades eligible for Uniforms should be classified under three categories as follows:

Category I: Officers whose nature of duties warrants a means of

identification/authority. Officers in this category are

required to wear uniforms.

Category II: Officers who are required to wear uniforms when the need

arises

Category III: Officers whose nature of duties causes excessive wear and

tear of clothing.

- Following the above recommendation, this Ministry issued Circular Letter No. 27 of 2003 requesting all Supervising Officers of Ministries/Departments to, inter-alia, determine under which category the grades which are entitled to uniforms would fall. A copy of the circular is enclosed for ease of reference.
- 3. New grades have since joined the Government Service and there is a need to update the list of categorised grades entitled to uniforms.
- In this context, it would be appreciated if you would submit to this Ministry, by Monday 7 March 2011 at latest, an updated list of categorised grades entitled to uniforms as well as those entitled to protective clothing/equipment as per the enclosed proforma.
