E-Duty Free Certificate

In line with its ongoing modernisation process, the Mauritius Revenue Authority (Customs Department) has introduced an e-duty free platform whereby public officers eligible for the purchase of a duty remitted car under the 2021 PRB Report can apply for duty exemption/remission online. The electronic application form can be accessed on www.mra.mu and the duty free certificate will be issued electronically.

- 2. The access and login credentials to the e-duty free certificate platform will be communicated to the respective Ministries/Departments in due course by the Mauritius Revenue Authority.
- 3. A 'Notice to Stakeholders' has been published on the Mauritius Revenue Authority website, where a user manual is also available to assist stakeholders.
- 4. Supervising Officers are hereby requested to bring the contents of this Circular to the attention of all concerned officers of their Ministries/Departments and Head of Parastatal Bodies and Local Authorities falling under the aegis of their respective Ministries/Departments.
