**Effective Date:** 10 December 2012

**Qualifications:** A. A degree, diploma or certificate which is recognised by the Council of Registered Professional Engineers of Mauritius as qualifying for registration as a Registered Professional Engineer of Mauritius under Section 13 of the Registered Professional Engineers Council Act No. 49 of 1965, and as subsequently amended, in one of the following fields from a recognised institution -

**I. For Training in Airframe and Power Plant**

- Aeronautical Engineering
- Aerospace Engineering

**NOTE**

In the absence of candidates possessing the qualification at A I above, consideration will be given to candidates who possess a degree, diploma or certificate in Mechanical Engineering with specialisation in Aircraft Structures and Power Plant.

**II. For Training in Avionics**

- Avionics Engineering
- Aeronautical Engineering
- Electronics and Communications Engineering

OR

Equivalent qualifications to A I and A II above acceptable to the Public Service Commission.

B. Candidates should be computer literate.

Candidates should produce written evidence of knowledge claimed.

**Training:**

Trainee Airworthiness Inspectors will be required to undergo and complete a period of training of at least two years and not exceeding three years by the end of which, they should have been registered as a Registered Professional Engineer of Mauritius in one of the fields mentioned at A I and A II above with the Council of Registered Professional Engineers of Mauritius under Section 13 of the Registered Professional Engineers Council Act No. 49 of 1965, and as subsequently amended, failing which their enlistment will be terminated.

For the purpose of training, any period of training undertaken in the Department as Pre-Registration Trainee Engineer will be reckoned as part of the two years training.

During the training period, Trainee Airworthiness Inspectors will work under the direct responsibility and supervision of an Airworthiness Inspector of the Department.

On being registered as a Registered Professional Engineer of Mauritius with the Council of Registered Professional Engineers of Mauritius and on successful completion of the training, Trainee Airworthiness Inspectors will be considered for appointment as Airworthiness Inspector in the appropriate field, as and when vacancies occur.

**Note**

Trainee Airworthiness Inspectors will be required to -

- (a) attend office, as and when required, after normal working hours, on Sundays, Public Holidays and officially declared cyclone days and during emergencies; and
- (b) undertake such theoretical and practical work as shall be considered necessary towards their training to be able to discharge their duties as Airworthiness Inspector.
