DISCIPLINED FORCES SERVICE COMMISSION REGULATIONS, 1997

Ministry: Land Transport, Shipping and Public Safety
(Fire Services)

Post: Deputy Controller *Deputy Chief Fire Officer*

Salary: Rs 12,800 x 400 - 14,000 x 500 - 15,500 (FRS 7)

Effective Date: 4 February, 1998

Qualifications: By promotion, on the basis of experience and merit, of officers in the grade of Chief Officer who:

- (i) are graduates of the Institute of Fire Engineers;
- (ii) reckon at least two years service in a substantive capacity in the grade inclusive of service in a substantive capacity in the former grade of Deputy Chief Officer, Fire Services or in the former grades of Deputy Chief Officer and First Officer in the Port Louis Fire Brigade Service;
- (iii) have administrative and managerial capability; and
- (iv) have ability to lead and motivate a large staff.

Note:

For the first intake, after the merger (on the date of coming into force of the Fire Services Amendment Act No. 21 of 1995) of the Port Louis Fire Brigade Service and the Government Fire Services, by appointment of persons holding a substantive appointment in the grade of Chief Officer in the Port Louis Fire Brigade Service although they may not possess the qualifications mentioned above.

Duties:

1. To assist the Controller in the administration and management of the service and to replace him in his absence.
2. To be responsible for the organisation and management of the Service including Training Unit, Fire Prevention, Control Room Unit, Workshop, Hydrant and Transport as may be directed by the Controller.
3. To be responsible for the implementation of delegated legislation in relation to fire prevention and protection of life and property.
4. To deliver lectures and talks to the staff within the Fire Services, as well as to the public, to school children and to other organisation in connection with fire prevention and protection of life and property.
5. To attend any fire, rescue operations and any other related emergencies.
6. To perform such cognate duties as may be assigned.

Note:

1. The Deputy Controller may be required to work after normal working hours at night, on public holidays, during weekends and on officially declared cyclone days.
2. The Deputy Controller may be required to follow such theoretical and practical training courses as may be approved and arranged.
