SCHEME OF SERVICE SPECIFIED UNDER REGULATION 15 OF THE  
PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION REGULATIONS

- Ministry:** Local Government and Solid Waste Management (Fire Services)
- Post:** Welder
- Salary:** Rs 6,275 x 150 – 7,325 x 175 – 8,200 x 200 – 9,000 x 250 – 10,000 x 300  
– 10,300 (25 12 33)
- Effective Date:** 20 January 2005
- Qualifications:** By selection from among serving officers who: -

- (i) have passed the appropriate trade test or possess the National Trade Certificate (Level 3) in Welding issued by the Mauritius Examinations Syndicate and the Industrial and Vocational Training Board or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission; and
- (ii) have a good knowledge of all safety precautions for eye protection and for electric shock.

In the absence of qualified serving officers, by selection from among candidates who-

- (i) possess the National Trade Certificate (Level 3) in Welding issued by the Mauritius Examinations Syndicate and the Industrial and Vocational Training Board or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission; and
- (ii) have a good knowledge of all safety precautions for eye protection and for electric shock.

- Duties:**
1. To carry out body repairs and maintenance work on different types of Fire Services vehicles, pumps and equipment.
  2. To perform electrical and oxy-acetylene welding works on different metals like mild steel, cast iron, aluminium, brass, etc., including metal cutting.
  3. To adopt correct measures to avoid under or over cutting of metal sheets.
  4. To carry out soldering operations and shape metal by hand to simple shapes.

5. To prepare work and simple patches for oxy-acetylene welding of vehicles bodies.
6. To dismantle and re-assemble component body parts of vehicles, water pumps and other fire fighting equipment.
7. To efficiently use all working and measuring instruments used in the trade.
8. To perform such cognate duties as may be assigned.

Welders may be required to work outside normal working hours including Sundays and Public Holidays.
