OR

B. By selection from among candidates who –

- (i) possess a Cambridge Higher School Certificate with passes at “Principal Level” in Chemistry and Physics obtained on one certificate or passes in Chemistry and Physics obtained on one certificate at the General Certificate of Education “Advanced Level”

or

possess the “Brevet de Technicien en fabrication mécanique” from a recognised institution;

- (ii) possess the Assistant Orthopaedic Technician (Orthosis Prosthesis) Certificate awarded after a minimum of two years’ training at a recognised institution; and
(iii) are computer literate.

OR

Equivalent qualifications to (i) and (ii) above acceptable to the Public Service Commission.

Duties:

1. To assist the Orthopaedic Technician (Orthosis Prosthesis) in the exercise of his duties, including cases referred to by Physicians from hospitals and community services and fill in technical record sheets.
2. To help in the establishment of procedures for the manufacture of orthopaedic appliances (Orthosis and Prosthesis).

3. To take necessary cast and measurement for patients who require appliances.
4. To select components and materials required for the manufacture of appliances.
5. To assemble components and make bio-mechanic alignment.
6. To devise components and supervise the production of such components.
7. To perform –
 - (i) the static and dynamic alignment and the fitting of the appliances on the patient under supervision;
 - (ii) the finishing work on the prosthesis and orthosis; and
 - (iii) repairs and modification works on orthopaedic appliances and to ensure follow-up.
8. To provide to patients and their relatives, if necessary, information on the use and maintenance of the orthopaedic appliances.
9. To manufacture orthopaedic appliances and all related walking aids, as and when required.
10. To work in collaboration with other rehabilitation services.
11. To impart technical skills, as and when required.
12. To manage workshop activities assigned to him including the use and maintenance of tools and equipment and maintenance of safe working environment and procedures.
13. To report any faulty equipment to the Orthopaedic Technician (Orthosis Prosthesis).
14. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
15. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Assistant Orthopaedic Technician (Orthosis Prosthesis) in the roles ascribed to him.
