- Qualifications:**
- A. A Master's Degree in Clinical Psychology or Counselling Psychology or Psychology from a recognised institution or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission.
- B. Candidates should –
- (i) be registered as an Allied Health Professional in the relevant field in accordance with section 16 of the Allied Health Professionals Council Act;
- (ii) possess good interpersonal and communication skills; and
- (iii) be computer literate.

Candidates should produce written evidence of knowledge claimed.

Role and Responsibilities: To provide counselling, psychological and psychotherapeutic services to police officers.

- Duties:**
1. To be responsible to the Chief Police Medical Officer through the Senior Psychologist for the performance of the following duties –
- (i) providing counselling and support services and psychological advice to police officers on matters relating to personal and emotional problems;
- (ii) providing psychotherapy to police officers and their families;
- (iii) assessing therapeutic needs of police officers and effecting site visits in the workplace, if required;

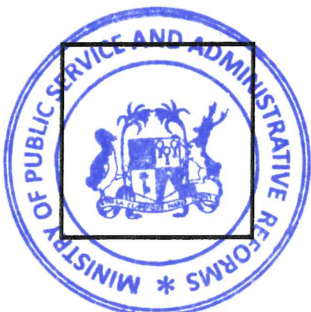

- (iv) devising, implementing and monitoring psychological assessment programmes and treatment services for police officers and effecting site visits in the workplace, if required;
 - (v) conducting mass counselling sessions;
 - (vi) collecting and updating data and ensuring the upkeep of records; and
 - (vii) providing police officers with referrals, where appropriate, for additional evaluation and/or treatment to other specialists or institutions, as necessary.
2. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
3. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Psychologist in the roles ascribed to him.

Note

Psychologists may be required to work outside normal working hours including Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays and during emergencies.
