**Post:** Blacksmith

**Salary:** Rs 11,425 x 250 – 13,675 x 300 – 15,475 x 350 – 17,225 x 450 – 19,475 x 600 – 20,675 x 750 – 21,425 (25 18 46)

**Effective Date:** 29 September 2015

**Qualifications:** By promotion, on the basis of experience and merit, of employees in the grade of Tradesman’s Assistant on the permanent and pensionable establishment of the Ministry who have passed the appropriate trade test.

- Duties:**
1. To carry out necessary measurements and calculations of the trade in accordance with technical specifications.
  2. To make from a pattern article any hand tools in general use such as hammers, setts, tongs and forge, harden, temper and grind chisels, among others.
  3. To make free-hand dimensioned sketches and to be able to read any drawing or blue print.
  4. To execute any forging from drawings or sketches.
  5. To construct cargo box and metal works from drawings or sketches.
  6. To case harden mild steel using various methods.
  7. To use and keep in good condition the tools in general use in the trade.
  8. To obtain materials from the Procurement and Supply section in accordance with correct procedures.
  9. To carry out simple welding works.
  10. To erect and dismantle tarpaulin tents, podium and scaffoldings.
  11. To use correctly the tools, equipment and accessories pertaining to the trade.
  12. To display and fix logistic such as flagpoles with flags, unveiling devices for different situations, red carpets and other decorative items.

15. To train and guide Tradesman's Assistants engaged in the same trade and other workers under his supervision.
16. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Blacksmith in the roles ascribed to him.
