Scheme of Service Specified Under Regulation 15 of the  
Public Service Commission Regulations, 1967

- Organisation:** Rodrigues Regional Assembly  
(Civil Aviation)
- Post:** Assistant Air Traffic Controller (Rodrigues)
- Salary:** Rs 8,370 x 300 – 11,370 x 400 – 12,970 x 500 – 13,970 (CIA 10)
- Effective Date:** 12 December 2002
- Qualifications:** By appointment of Trainee Assistant Air Traffic Controllers (Rodrigues) who have successfully completed an approved course of training in Air Traffic Services.
- Duties:**
1. To be responsible for the following:
    - (a) to provide Aerodrome Flight Information Service and alerting service to all aircraft operating in and out of Plaine Corail Airport and its vicinity;
    - (b) to coordinate traffic data with the Mauritius Flight Information Centre/Plaisance Approach Control Office;
    - (c) to monitor and plot aircraft tracks;
    - (d) to manage flight progress strips;
    - (e) to provide information on aircraft movements to the airport and aircraft operator;
    - (f) to provide all available information relating to overdue or unreported aircraft to the Mauritius FIC/Approach Office;
    - (g) to execute instructions or directives issued by the Mauritius FIC/Approach Office promptly;
    - (h) to exchange information with Airport Operators, Aircraft Operators and the Meteorological Services, as appropriate, for the safety and efficiency of aircraft operations;
    - (i) to provide aerodrome emergency, search and rescue alerting services;
    - (j) to report immediately any notifiable air safety occurrence to the Mauritius FIC/Approach Office followed by written reports;
    - (k) to report degradation of all communications, navigations and aerodrome facilities to the appropriate authorities;
    - (l) to keep such records and prepare such returns as may be required.
  2. To perform such cognate duties as may be assigned.

**NOTE**

Assistant Air Traffic Controllers (Rodrigues) are required to work on shift, covering a 24-hour service including night duty and work on Sundays, Public Holidays, and officially declared cyclone days and during emergencies.
