A Cambridge School Certificate preferably with passes in Chemistry and Physics or Passes obtained on one certificate at the General Certificate of Education “Ordinary Level” either (i) in five subjects including English Language and preferably Chemistry and Physics, with at least Grade C in any two subjects or (ii) in six subjects including English Language and preferably Chemistry and Physics, with at least Grade C in any one subject or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission.
 - B. A good physique with the following minimum physical requirements:-
 - Height: 1 m 70
 - Chest: 84 cm (normal inspiration)
 - Normal eye sight (without glasses)
 - C. A Goods Vehicle Driving Licence.

Note 1

In the absence of candidates holding a Goods Vehicle Driving Licence, consideration will be given to candidates otherwise qualified but who hold a Private Car Driving Licence.

Note 2


All selected candidates will be required to obtain at least a Service Driving Licence for car and van before being eligible for appointment as Fireman in a substantive capacity.

**SCHEME OF SERVICE SPECIFIED UNDER REGULATION 15 OF THE
PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION REGULATIONS**

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Duties

1. To maintain and man fire appliances, fire equipment and aerodrome fire stations.
2. To assist in preserving lives, controlling and extinguishing fires including aircraft fires and effecting rescue of persons and property.
3. To attend parades and perform physical training and fire drills.
4. To perform the duties of an officeman, keeping the Occurrence Book, answer telephone calls and raise fire alarms.
5. To perform the duties of sentry over fire appliances and the duties of runway guard.
6. To maintain and man fire rescue boat, life-rafts and related equipment.
7. To participate in rescue operations during national calamities and major accidents.
8. To attend the aircraft movements and to ensure that the aircraft movement areas are clear and safe for landing, take-off, taxiing and parking.
9. To refuel fire appliances and to carry out minor servicing on them.
10. To make periodical inspections of obstruction in the airfield area and of fire hydrants, fire extinguishers and other related fire fighting appliances belonging to the Division.
11. To take charge of a crew during fire fighting and in addition, to organise simple drills and replace the Sub-Officer, as and when necessary.
12. To carry out all appropriate duties to enable the Sub-Officer to fulfill his operational obligations including the wearing of breathing apparatus and the driving of fire appliances and ancillary vehicles.
13. To perform such cognate duties as may be assigned.

Note

1. Firemen will be required to work on a shift system, covering a 24-hour service including Sundays, Public Holidays and officially declared cyclone days.
2. They will be required to follow any training course at departmental training unit or at any other training institution, as approved and arranged.
