**Organisation:** Rodrigues Regional Assembly (Fisheries)

**Post:** Principal Fisheries Protection Officer

**Salary:** Rs 24,475 x 525 – 26,050 x 675 – 27,400 x 825 – 35,650 x 900 – 37,450 x 950 – 42,200 QB 43,500 (19 053 076)

**Effective Date:** 29 December 2023

**Qualifications:** By promotion, on the basis of experience and merit, of officers in the grade of Senior Fisheries Protection Officer who reckon at least four years' service in a substantive capacity in the grade and who possess –

(i) the Diploma in Forestry and Fisheries from a recognised institution issued as at 31 December 2020

or

a diploma in Fisheries Science or a diploma in Fisheries Enabled Services from a recognised institution or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission;

- (ii) good organising and supervisory skills; and
- (iii) good interpersonal and communication skills.

**NOTE**

Principal Fisheries Protection Officers will be allowed to proceed beyond the Qualification Bar (QB) in the salary scale provided they possess the Diploma in Fisheries and Forestry or a diploma in Fisheries Science or a diploma in Fisheries Enabled Services from a recognised institution or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission.

**Duties:**

1. To be in charge of one or more Fisheries Posts.
2. To assist the Assistant Controller, Fisheries Protection Service (Rodrigues) in the discharge of his duties.
3. To ensure that all activities at Fish Landing Stations, Fishing Ports, Sand Removal Sites and any other stations are properly carried out.

4. To monitor the list of professional fishermen eligible to draw bad weather and close season allowances.
5. To ensure that enforcement duties are properly carried out within the boundaries of the Fisheries Post(s) and also to effect coast and afloat patrol, drive official vehicles and man patrol boats, whenever required.
6. To promote good industrial relations by providing extension services, proper advice and guidance to fishermen/fishermen organisations and taking prompt action to settle grievances and conflicts through negotiation and discussion.
7. To assist in the implementation of projects relating to fisheries management, marine resources and marine conservation.
8. To ensure that up-to-date records of all fishermen including records on boats, occurrences and exhibits are properly kept.
9. To perform prosecution duties including preparation of case files and drafting of court charges.
10. To compile evidence for the issue, renewal and cancellation of licences in accordance with Fisheries Laws and Regulations.
11. To be responsible for the training and sensitisation of fishermen and other stakeholders.
12. To be in charge of petty stores/Exhibit Room.
13. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
14. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Principal Fisheries Protection Officer in the roles ascribed to him.

**Note**

1. Principal Fisheries Protection Officers may be required to work outside normal working hours including Sundays and Public Holidays.
2. Principal Fisheries Protection Officers may be called upon to walk on the seabed up to one meter water level, swim and skin dive.
