- (iv) in the preparation of/carrying out outdoor educational programmes.
- 3. To attend official committees in matters relating to cleaning/scavenging works and disposal of wastes.
- 4. To prepare weekly and monthly reports of complaints on pollution cases and other environmental related issues.
- 5. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
- 6. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Environment Enforcement Officer in the roles ascribed to him.

Note

Environment Enforcement Officers may be required to work after office hours including Saturdays, Sundays, Public Holidays and during cyclonic periods and natural calamities.
