Service Driving Licence for Self-Driven Government Cars

Following the issue of this Ministry's Circular Note No. 1 of 2001, senior officers who benefit from the exclusive use of a self-driven Government car both for official and private use, requested that the same facilities granted to officers eligible for a chauffeur-driven car be extended to them.

- After consultation with the Solicitor-General, it has been decided that the official self-driven government car may be driven by the officer to whom the official car has been allocated and by any other person holding a valid driving licence, provided he or she has been specifically authorised by the senior official to do so.
- 3. In view of the foregoing, officers eligible for a self-driven government car are requested to submit the names of three persons, whom they have authorised to drive such vehicle, as well as the additional information required by the Assistant Commissioner of Police, Traffic Branch, (vide paragraph 3 of this Ministry's Circular Note No. 1 of 2001), to the Police Department with copy to the Ministry of Finance and to this Ministry.
- 4. Supervising Officers are kindly requested to bring the contents of this circular to the attention of eligible officers.
