Revision of Travelling Allowances

As announced in the 2022/2023 Budget Speech, provisions have been made for petrol and travelling allowances to be increased by 10%, subject to a maximum of Rs 2,000. Consequently, in consultation with the Ministry of Finance, Economic Planning and Development, the following new rates are applicable with effect from 01 July 2022:


S/N	Type of Travelling Allowances	Eligibility	Revised Quantum (Monthly) Rs
I.	Travelling Allowance	Officers drawing a monthly basic salary of Rs 44,800 and Rs 46,100 as well as those not owning a car but drawing a monthly basic salary of Rs 47,675 or more and who are not in receipt of a travel grant or travelling/petrol allowance.	Rs 2,660 or refund of bus fares, whichever is the higher.
II.	Travel Grant	Officers drawing a monthly basic salary of Rs 47,675 and up to Rs 62,700 and who are not eligible for 100% duty exemption but own a car.	Rs 8,250
III.	Travelling Allowance	(i) Officers drawing a monthly basic salary of Rs 64,400 but less than Rs 97,625 including officers whose grades are mentioned at paragraph 16.2.15 (No. 3) of the 2021 PRB Report who are eligible for 100% duty exemption for the purchase of a car. (ii) Officers drawing a monthly basic salary of Rs 54,200 and above in a scale the maximum of which is not less than Rs 77,950.	Rs 13,200 or refund of mileage together with a monthly commuted allowance of Rs 3,260, in case officers perform official travelling.

IV.	Fixed cost and Travelling Allowance	Officers drawing a monthly basic salary of Rs 97,625 or more but not eligible for a chauffeur/self-driven car.	Rs 2,460 (Fixed Cost) Rs 13,200

V.	Travelling by car/mileage	(i) Refund of mileage for official travelling at the rate of Rs 11.65 per km for the first 800 km. (ii) Rs 7.25 per km for mileage in excess of 800 km. (iii) Rs 7.25 per km for distance which is not considered as official mileage (from residence to office) on days on which officers are required to carry out field duties.	
VI.	Travelling by Motorcycle/mileage	(i) Refund of mileage for official travelling at the rate of Rs 3.75 per km. (ii) Rs 2.70 per km for distance not considered as official travelling (from residence to office) on days on which officers are required to carry out field duties or refund of travelling by bus, whichever is higher.	
VII.	Travelling by Autocycle/mileage	(i) Refund of mileage for official travelling at the rate of Rs 3.10 per km. (ii) Rs 2.10 per km for distance not considered as official travelling (from residence to office) on days on which officers are required to carry out field duties or refund of travelling by bus, whichever is higher.
