<u>Fire Certificate – Framework Agreement for the Supply and Fixing of Fire Extinguishers, Emergency</u> <u>Lightings and Fire Safety Signs</u>

In October 2021, the Ministry introduced a Framework Agreement to facilitate the procurement of fire safety items, namely fire extinguishers, emergency lightings and fire safety signs by Ministries and Departments. The Framework Agreement has greatly helped the procurement of these items for the obtention of fire certificates at the level of Ministries and Departments. It is in this context that this Ministry has carried out an exercise for a new Framework Agreement in January 2023, valid for a period of 12 months.

2. Your Ministry/Department may now proceed with the acquisition of the following fire safety items from the selected suppliers as per the table below:

- 4. This Ministry has been assigned with the responsibility of monitoring and reporting progress on fire certificates to Government on a regular basis. In this context, Supervising Officers are hereby requested to ensure that all buildings requiring minor improvements under their purview obtain their fire certificates by the end of June 2023.
