**SCHEME OF SERVICE SPECIFIED UNDER REGULATION 15 OF THE
PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION REGULATIONS**

- Ministry:** Agro-Industry and Food Security
- Post:** Incinerator Operator
- Salary:** Rs 13,010 x 260 – 14,050 x 275 – 15,150 x 300 – 15,750 x 325 – 17,700 x 375 – 19,575 x 475 – 21,950 x 625 – 23,200 x 775 – 23,975 (24 023 052)
- Effective Date:** 18 September 2017
- Qualifications:** By selection from among employees on the permanent and pensionable establishment of the Ministry who reckon at least eight years' service and who –
- (a) possess the Certificate of Primary Education; and
 - (b) have practical knowledge of mechanics and electricity or electronics.

NOTE 1

In the absence of candidates possessing the Certificate of Primary Education, consideration will be given to candidates who show proof of being literate.

NOTE 2

Selected candidates will be appointed in a temporary capacity in the first instance and will be required to undergo on-the-job training in all aspects of the work of an Incinerator Operator for a period of at least six months. On satisfactory completion of the training and on being favourably reported upon, they will be considered for appointment as Incinerator Operator in a substantive capacity.

Candidates should produce written evidence of knowledge claimed.

- Duties:**
1. To be responsible to the Senior Technical Officer or Agricultural Support Officer/Senior Agricultural Support Officer for –
 - (a) the operation of the incinerator and associated equipment according to operating instructions and safety norms in connection with –
 - (i) the destruction of pantry refuse from aircrafts or vessels and other materials as directed;
 - (ii) the destruction of animal carcasses after post-mortem analysis, imported meat discarded after necessary tests, media after performing cultures and other materials as directed; and

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- (iii) incineration of waste from the laboratory;
 - (b) the day-to-day maintenance of the incinerator plant and related equipment including minor repairs and servicing;
 - (c) the record of waste incinerated;
 - (d) the segregation of waste; and
 - (e) the removal of ashes from the incinerator and premises after each operation.
2. To carry out regular checks and report immediately any fault or breakdown to the Senior Technical Officer and the Agricultural Support Officer/Senior Agricultural Support Officer.
 3. To keep the incinerator and its environment clean and tidy at all times.
 4. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Incinerator Operator in the roles ascribed to him.

Note

Incinerator Operators will be required to work outside normal working hours including Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.
