

SCHEME OF SERVICE SPECIFIED UNDER REGULATION 16 OF THE DISCIPLINED FORCES SERVICE COMMISSION REGULATIONS, 1997

Ministry: Land Transport, Shipping and Public Safety (Fire Services)

Post: Chief officer (Assistant Chief Fire Officer)

Salary: Rs 9,600 x 400 - 11,600 (FRS 5)

Effective Date: 4 February, 1998

Qualifications: By promotion, on the basis of experience and merit, of officers in the grade of Divisional Officer reckoning at least two years service in a substantive capacity in the grade inclusive of service in a substantive capacity in the grade of Second Officer in the Port Louis Fire Brigade Service and who:

- (i) are graduates of the Institute of Fire Engineers;
- (ii) have good administrative, organising and supervisory skills; and
- (iii) are able to communicate clearly and effectively.

Note:

For the first intake, after the merger (on the date of coming into force of the Fire Services Amendment Act No. 21 of 1995) of the Port Louis Fire Brigade Service and the Government Fire Services, by appointment of persons holding a substantive appointment in the grades of First Officer and Deputy Chief Officer in the Port Louis Fire Brigade Service although they may not possess the qualifications mentioned above.

Duties:

1. To be responsible to the Deputy Controller for specific areas of operation including Training Unit, Fire Prevention, Radio Communication Unit, Workshop, Hydrant and Transport as may be directed by the Controller.

2. To be responsible for the maintenance of adequate staff at all times and for matters of discipline, training of personnel and welfare.
3. To prepare and deliver lectures and talks on fire prevention and firefighting in the Service as well as in outside organisations.
4. To be responsible for the monitoring of projects generally and in particular projects involving
 - (a) the acquisition of equipment and gears; and
 - (b) the construction, maintenance, repairs and renovation of Fire Service buildings and premises.
5. To arrange for the supply of items of stores as required.
6. To attend to fire, rescue operations and other related emergencies.
7. To perform such cognate duties as may be assigned.

Note:

1. The Chief Officer may be required to work after normal working hours at night, on public holidays, during weekends and on officially declared cyclone days.
2. The Chief Officer may be required to follow such theoretical and practical training courses as may be approved and arranged.
