- 2. To collect from and deliver materials to the Procurement and Supply Unit.
- 3. To make, repair and recondition all leather items such as boots, shoes, pouches, satchels, belts and others entrusted to him by the Master Leather Worker and/or Assistant Master Leather Worker.
