- Qualifications:** A. By appointment of Trainee Police Medical Officers who have successfully completed their training and who are registered as specialist in Forensic Medicine in accordance with legislation in force in Mauritius.

OR

- B. By selection from among candidates who –
 - (i) are registered as general practitioner and as specialist in Forensic Medicine in accordance with legislation in force in Mauritius;
 - (ii) reckon at least two years’ experience as general practitioner in any recognised health institution; and
 - (iii) are computer literate.

Candidates should produce written evidence of experience/knowledge claimed.

- Duties:** 1. To be responsible to the Commissioner of Police through the Chief Police Medical Officer for –
 - (i) giving medical care to all members of the Police Force and their families;
 - (ii) providing medical assistance in rescue operations and accompanying the Special Mobile Force, National Coast Guard, Special Supporting Unit and Helicopter Unit on selected missions, on board ships at sea and the Outer Islands;

- (iii) undertaking medical/medico-legal examinations (both clinical and pathological) and giving evidence in Courts of Law;
 - (iv) attending to medical/medico-legal examinations in Rodrigues and Outer Islands; and
 - (v) delivering lectures to members of the Police Force on subjects of medical interests such as forensic medicine.
2. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
3. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officer in the roles ascribed to him.

Note

Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officers will be required to be on call to cater for medical/medico-legal examinations after normal working hours including Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.
