By promotion, on the basis of experience and merit, of officers in the grade of Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officer.

Duties:

- 1. To be responsible to the Commissioner of Police through the Chief Police Medical Officer for:-
 - (i) providing daily consultation for members of the Force under his control (inclusive of the Special Mobile Force) and their families and all those entitled to medical treatment in the Force:
 - (ii) undertaking medico-legal examinations (both clinical and pathological) during and after normal working hours for Mauritius, Rodrigues and Outer Islands;
 - (iii) delivering lectures to members of the Force on subjects of medical and medico-legal importance;
 - (iv) ascertaining the fitness of all personnel engaged on special duties, viz:- Pilots, Divers, etc.;
 - (v) supervising the medical examination of candidates for enlistment in the Force and ascertaining their ensuing fitness for service;
 - (vi) ensuring a high standard of health and safety of the working environment of the Police Force; and
 - (vii) supervising and training Trainee Police Medical Officers.
