- 2. Australia Awards Scholarships demonstrate Australia's commitment to the 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development and its contribution to the long-term development needs of Australia's partner countries in line with Australia's aid priorities and bilateral and regional agreements.
- 3. The Australian Government will cover the costs of full tuition fees, return air travel, establishment allowance and living expenses as well as costs related to an introductory Academic Program, Overseas Student Health Cover and visa expenses.
- 4. Applications are invited from suitable candidates who wish to be considered for the above scholarships during the academic year 2019. For more information regarding the course requirements, course contents and online application form, applicants may access the website https://www.australiaawardsafrica.org/awards/apply/. The eligibility criteria for Australia Awards Short Courses set out by the Australian Authorities are at **Annex**.
- 5. Applications should be submitted electronically as per the instructions available on the website **www.australiaawardsafrica.org**, to the Managing Contractor for the Australia Awards-Africa.
- 6. Applicants are strongly recommended to submit a copy of their application, through their respective Supervising Officers, to the Human Resource Development Division of this Ministry (attention Mrs J. Narayanasami Reddi). The closing date for submission of applications is 15 January 2019.
- 7. Given that **release** is **subject to the exigencies of the service**, applicants should imperatively seek and obtain confirmation from their respective Responsible Officers that they would be released in the event they are awarded the scholarship. Release can either be on full pay or without pay as follows:
 - a) an officer shall be eligible for study leave with pay in accordance with paragraph 4.10.1(b) of the Human Resource Management Manual (HRMM) where he is nominated for an open scholarship which is considered as in-service training and the course is a priority field of study. Where an officer is granted study leave with pay, he will be required to enter into a bond with the Government of Mauritius in accordance with the provisions laid down in the HRMM; and
 - b) where the officer does not satisfy the conditions for the grant of study leave with pay, he may take advantage of leave without pay for study purposes in accordance with paragraph 18.4.82G of the 2016 PRB Report.
- 8. It would be appreciated if the contents of this Circular Letter could be brought to the attention of all eligible officers serving in the different Divisions of your Ministry/Department, as well as those in Statutory Bodies falling under the purview of your Ministry.

Short Course Information for students from Mauritius

- You are a national of Mauritius.
- You are at least 25 and not more than 50 years of age at the date of application.
- You have at least 3 years' work experience in a relevant policy, practice, research or reform role following graduation. Preference will be given to candidates with greater periods of experience.
- You are an early- or mid-level career professional working in the public sector, civil society or private sector in one of the listed priority fields of study.
- You have a clear vision of how you will use the knowledge gained through the award program to improve policy or practice in Mauritius in your proposed field of study.
- You must be willing to make a formal commitment to return to Mauritius and your current employment following the completion of the award.

- Gender equality: Australia Awards targets equal participation by women and men.
- Disability inclusion: Australia Awards aims to ensure that people with a disability are given fair and equal opportunity to compete for and obtain a Scholarship.
