Celebration of Africa Day of the Civil Service and Administration

The Africa Day of the Civil Service and Administration will be celebrated in African numbers on 23 June, 2003 around the theme; "Strengthening Civil Service Capacity for Stained Achievement of NEPAD's Goals".

 - to create awareness of Public Officers regarding the Windhoek Declaration which was adopted at the 3rd Meeting of Pan African Ministers of the Public Service and Administration held in Windhoek, Namibia, in February 2001. A copy of the Declaration is enclosed.
- This Ministry is proposing to organise a one-day celebration on Sunday, 22 June 2003, pd to publish a special magazine to mark the event.

INDHOEK ICLARATION

We, African Public Service Ministers, meeting on the occasion of the Third Pan-Hiran Conference of Public Service Ministers held in Windhoek, on 5-6 February 2001.

Recalling Resolution 50/225 of the United Nations General Assembly on "Public Mministration and Development" adopted at its 50th Resumed Session.

Reaffirming the need to strengthen national public administrations in order to prome social and economic development and to meet the challenges of globalization through access modern information technology.

Recalling the recommendation of the Rabat Declaration on the elaboration of a Carter for the Public Service in Africa, which affirms the professional values of the public service in Africa, redefines its objectives and missions and specifies the fundamental conditions revired for strengthening its role, competence, ethical values and image, including a code of moduct for African public service employees.

Having considered and amended the draft of the Charter elaborated by the Working Goup established by the 2nd Pan-African Conference supported by CAFRAD and UNDESA.

I. Adopt unanimously the Charter for the Public Service in Africa which:

- Defines a framework to guide the public services in Africa in taking such legislative, sulatory, technical and practical measures as may be required to create propinious conditions for teproper functioning of the public service and improve the quality of its services:
- States and defines the principles and rules of conduct for public service and State eployees, who shall foster a neutral and stable environment conductive to the strengthening of thick values and the image of the public service, as well as the professionalism of its employees;
- Expresses the will of African States and underscores their political and moral committent to improve the services provided to citizens and ensure the efficient use of the resources accepted for such services;
- Request the Chairman of the Conference to submit the text of the Charter to the 56th union of the General Assembly, which will review the implementation of resolution 50/225.
- 3. Commit to establish and/or strengthen at the national level mechanisms for the openentation and dissemination of the Charter by involving the highest levels of Government and assuring the wide participation of all stakeholders in order to ensure respect for the principles, thus and rules defined in the Charter.
- 4. Request CAFRAD, in cooperation with African regional and sub-regional institutions and purings to develop strategies, plans, tools and monitoring mechanisms to assist the African Countries in the implementation of the Charter.
- 5. Request UNDESA in cooperation with ECA to assist the national and regional efforts by poiding advisory services and appropriate tools such as training modules and materials, adovisual instruments and methodologies and make available, and if necessary expand, the bited Nations Public Administration Network (UNPAN) its facilities and connectivity for the injementation of the Charter.
- 6. Reaffirm the crucial role played by the national public administration, schools and moutes and the need to develop and strengthen their ability to prepare the public servants of the lare to deal with the challenges of globalization.

- 7. Request the sub-regional, regional and international institutions in public administration and co-ordinate their efforts in order to support the national institutes.
- 8. Request UNDESA in co-operation with CAFRAD and other organizations to support the regency training needs in public administration through the utilization of ICT and distance rung technologies.
- 9. Request UNDESA to exercise its good offices to seek appropriate resources from anational institutions and bilateral donors to support the efforts for the implementation of the latter for the Public Service in Africa and for new capacity building needs of African countries in size of globalization.
- 10. Express profound gratitude to the Government and people of Namibia for their warm
