<u>Australia Awards - Australian Development Scholarships 2011</u>

The Australian Government, in partnership with the Ministry of Civil Service and Administrative Reforms, is offering a limited number of Australian Development Scholarships commencing in January 2011. The scholarships are for study for 12-24 months at Masters-level in Australia at Australian Universities in the following priority fields of study:

- Management of public private partnership
- Trade/international trade
- Diplomacy
- ➤ Public sector reform (including financial management, human resource management and public program planning)
- ➤ Other public policy fields formally recognised to be of national or regional priority.
- 2. Scholarships cover airfares, tuition fees, medical cover and a living allowance in Australia. Female applicants and people with disabilities are encouraged to apply.
- 3. Study in Australia is subject to the successful applicant being issued with a visa by the Australian Department of Immigration & Citizenship (DIAC). As part of the visa application process, immigration authorities require candidates to undergo a full medical examination including a chest X-ray and an HIV/AIDS test.

- 4. The scholarships offered are subject to the following criteria:
 - applicants should be from Mauritian public-sector, government or parastatal agencies to ensure that training benefits are dispersed as quickly and as widely as possible;
 - in keeping with AusAID's gender equity policy, there should be an equitable distribution of awards to male and female applicants;
 - applicants are required to possess, as a minimum, a three-year Bachelor's degree and at least two years' post-graduation work experience in a public sector role relevant to your proposed field of study;
 - applicants must not already hold or be studying a Masters degree;
 - only applicants less than 50 years of age at the time of application may apply; and
 - Postgraduate Diploma or Masters level programs are limited to between one and two years duration.

The deadline for submission of preliminary applications is 30 April 2010.
